

PARENT RIGHT TO KNOW NOTICE

As a parent or guardian of a student in a Title I school, parents/guardians have the right to request information on the professional qualifications of your student's teacher. The information must state if:

- The teacher meets State Qualifications/licensure requirements,
- The teacher is teaching under an Emergency Teaching Certificate,
- The teacher has a baccalaureate degree,
- The child receives services from a paraprofessional and
- The qualifications of the paraprofessional.

Title I schools are those schools that qualify for federal funding as a result of a high percentage of students from low-income families. To qualify as a Title I school, a school typically has around 40% or more students come from families who qualify under the United States Census's definitions as low-income, according to the U.S. Department of Education. Title I states that it gives priority to schools that are in obvious needs of funds, low-achieving schools, and schools that demonstrate a commitment to improving their education standards and test scores.
