#### Try a Theatre Game!

#### The Interview

- 1. Send one student out of the room far away enough so they cannot hear what is going on.
- 2. The class decides what job the person who is gone is interviewing for. Once you have a job have the person who left come back.
- 3. The person sits in front of class and the rest of class asks them interview questions based on that job. The person being interviewed needs to guess what job they are interviewing for.

Example: Mary leaves class and while she is gone the class decides she is going to interview for Santa Clause. Another student goes to bring her back and has her sit in front of the room. Students ask her questions such as "What is your favorite type of cookie? Would you be willing to gain 200 pounds for this job? Do you get along with children? How do you feel about reindeer? Mary then guesses that she is interviewing for Santa Clause. Then she picks a new person to leave.
