Agua Fria High School returns for its 5th Year of Angel Tree Donations

Agua Fria High School is diving into its 5th year of giving back to 120 students who otherwise wouldn't have presents this year. Agua Fria has had the chance to build a website, aguafria.org/angel-tree, where you can go and choose your angel and purchase the items needed, all in one place.

Donating is a simple process. Upon selecting a student and an item chosen to donate, the website will navigate the donor to a checkout screen. A confirmation email with information stating the item the donor has selected and directions on turning in the gift is then sent. Once all donations have been checked in, the school opens up for a gift-wrapping party for students and staff on Friday, December 15th, and Monday, December 18th, from 2 pm to 4 pm. These gifts are then taken to the families of the kids for whom they have been selected.

As the school gets into the holiday season, Agua Fria's outstanding principal, Mrs. Daniels, describes this as an "owl family, and the community being a light and providing hope during the holiday season." It is also mentioned that 52 of those 120 students are current owls of Agua Fria, and the other 68 are coming from our "neighboring feeder schools students," as stated by Mrs. Daniels.

This event has been set up thanks to Agua Fria's community relations specialist, Ms. Allison Rai. Many of the high school staff have praised Ms. Rai for organizing this and striving to do the best she can to get all 120 students their gifts this Christmas.
